BRO. MARSHALL'S MESSAGE

Willing to Serve

Acts 8:5 *Philip went down to the city of Samaria and began proclaiming the Christ to them.*

In Acts 6 we read about a disagreement within the church. There was a daily distribution of food for the widows in the church and the Greek believers thought that their widows were being neglected so they brought this to the attention of the Apostles. Instead of ignoring the problem or attempting to fix it themselves, the Apostles told the church to select seven men who were full of the Spirit and in good standing to handle this issue. This seemed to solve the problem. Philip was one of these men. He, along with the other six were tasked with serving the food to all of the widows in the church. Philip was selected to be a servant and took his new position seriously. As we read further in Acts, we see in chapter 8 that persecution arose and many in the church scattered. Philip was among those who were scattered, but he did not seek to hide, rather continued serving the Lord. He found himself in Samaria and began to preach the gospel! The people of that area listened intently, began to believe, and were soon baptized, starting a new church. Philip had struggles there because of a man named Simon who was a sorcerer and full of pride. Simon believed the gospel, was baptized, but desired to recover his great standing among the people. We see in the end; he repented of his pride. The Holy Spirit worked through Philip to change the lives of the people in the Jerusalem church and in Samaria.

Bottom line, Philip was willing to serve. Serve food to widows and serve as an evangelist, discipler and church planter in Samaria. You see when Philip was called to serve, he did not care if he was out front or behind the scenes, if he was recognized or not, he only wanted to be used by the Lord for the glory of His church! This is how we must be. Are you willing to serve? Do you currently serve? If so, are you willing to serve as Philip served; in whatever way the Lord sees fit? We must not only be willing to serve when it suits us, but all the time!

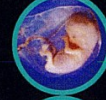
